Every Day Matters

Every day matters, right until the last day of term. Being at school every day, wherever possible, boosts confidence and helps children to build and maintain friendships. By attending school every day your child will get the most out of their learning and improve their career and life options.

When your child is absent it is important you let the school know, including the reason why, on the day or the day after. This helps make sure we know where our students are and can offer support for you and your family if needed.

If you are having trouble getting your child to school every day or on time, please talk to your child's teacher so we can work together, because every day counts.

A reminder that, wherever possible, holidays should only be booked during school breaks and students should be at school every day during school term, right from beginning to end. Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day per fortnight, that's 4 weeks of missed learning in one year. Over an entire school journey this adds up to 1 year of lost learning.

PBL award for the week: Demonstrating a growth mindset in lessons


